Beatrix Potter was from a wealthy, somewhat unconventional family and was privately educated. She showed a keen interest in science, especially biology, as well as in art. A major scientific work she tried to submit was rejected because of her gender. This work has only in recent years been published and praised. Her interest in animals extended to raising them on a huge farm with her husband and was put to artistic use in her creating the illustrated works about Peter Rabbit.

She was a feminist for her times in the late Victorian age.





Public Policy: Resources and Programs Affecting Our Lives By Kathleen Crawford, Public Policy Chair

If you are like me, the beginning of the New Year is a time for reflection and intention to make some personal growth goals! I encourage you to consider taking a more active role in our AAUW branch as well as participating in the public policy program on both the CA state and national AAUW organizational levels.

One way to begin is to sign up for the CCRWF (California Center for Research on Women & Families) 2015 Policy Summit on Wednesday January 14, 2015 at the Sacramento Convention Center. CCRWF is a coalition partner with AAUW and this one day policy summit is packed with superb speakers and information on issues important to the AAUW mission and goals. Take advantage of Early Registration (ends January 2, 2015) and you will be joining several of our branch members in attendance. Speakers include the Speaker of the Assembly, Toni G. Atkins, Senators Holly Mitchell and Hannah-Beth Jackson as well as influential policy makers Jessica Bartholow (Advocate with Western Center on Law and Poverty), Judy Patrick (Director of Public Policy for the Women's Foundation of CA) and Sharon Terman (Senior Staff Attorney for the Work & Family Program of the Legal Aid Society). There are over 20 organizations participating in the Women's Health Policy Fair. Attendance last year included many younger career women working in the capitol, so it is an exciting and interesting day. Please let me know if you register so we can try to meet up with you during the summit.

A new legislative session starts in January with newly elected state senate and assembly members getting seated with new committee assignments. There will be many bills with proposed implications for women, girls, families and education which the CA AAUW Public Policy committee will be reviewing with recommended actions.

On the federal level, 2014 ended up with continuing controversy over campus sexual assault and violence continuing to dominate media stories. The implementation of Title IX guidelines will assist and instruct campuses on this important safety protection for all students. The \$1 trillion budget bill passed in December is a mixed bag of good (increased Pell grants for students) and bad (huge increases to individual limits on campaign spending) in terms of AAUW positions. The issue of minimum wage was on 5 state ballots in November and all passed increases to state minimum wages. This directly benefits women and families in the lowest economic situations. As we know, CA minimum wage is higher than federal minimum wage and currently has increases scheduled into the near future. A recent Department of Labor study showed that between 3.5% and 6.5% of all wage and salary workers nationally make less than the federal minimum wage, most commonly in the restaurant and hotel industries. Should an increase in the federal minimum wage bill be introduced? Watch for possible action in 2015.

Take advantage of our women power and join in the advocacy efforts. On the National AAUW website, please sign up at advocacy@aauw.org for the Two Minute Activist and weekly emails on federal issues. Postings included information on AAUW's continuing pursuit of Equal Pay legislation at both state and national levels as well as updates on the Supreme Court consideration of the Pregnancy Discrimination case in Young v UPS. Once you sign up on the national site, you are automatically registered for the CA State Alert messages. Be informed on the work undertaken in the name of our organization and membership!

If you are interested in working on a branch program meeting in the spring on the issues of pay equity or minimum wage, please contact me by phone or email.


A new and easy way to help the branch!
