## Students Will Compete in Speech Trek Contest Michele Stark, Chair



#### Tech Trek Back on Track By Kim Lillard, Chair

Despite encountering a few minor obstacles and time setbacks due to joining with National Tech Trek this year, we in the Roseville-South Placer branch are back on track with our Tech Trek program and heading into the nominations phase of the process. To our delight, this year we have received commitments from 14 of our middle schools, who have agreed to participate in this year's nominations process! In addition, this year marks the first year we are offering e-mail delivery of all the packet information to any and all schools who want to process their paperwork solely via e-mail. Thus far we have approximately half of the schools participating solely through e-mail, and we are anticipating more will avail themselves of this option as well. This, of course, will significantly cut down on the woman-hours and paperwork costs needed to facilitate the nomination and selection processes.



Science, math and technology teachers from our area have until January 29, 2016, to submit their two nominations per school for 7th grade female students to have a chance to be chosen for the next part of the process, which is the application and essay questions, and the formal interview. The AAUW RSP Tech Trek committee will hold the essay/interview portion of the Tech Trek camp application in the spring of 2016.
